



## Manitoba Registration or Certificate of Practice Not Required

### Purpose:

To set out the requirements for when registration or a certificate of practice are not required to engage in practice as a registered nurse in Manitoba.

### Policy:

1. The College will not take any action pursuant to *The Regulated Health Professions Act* (the “RHPA”) where a person who is registered as a registered nurse in another Canadian jurisdiction is involved in:
  - a. Virtual practice for a person residing within the geographical boundaries of Manitoba provided:
    - i. the registered nurse is currently registered in another Canadian jurisdiction and meets the practice expectations of that jurisdiction;
    - ii. the registered nurse identifies their full name, membership class and jurisdiction(s) of licensure to the Manitoba client as part of the informed consent process;
    - iii. the registered nurse abides by all relevant federal and provincial (Manitoba) legislation for the services provided via virtual practice; and
    - iv. the registered nurse does not physically enter Manitoba for the purposes of providing direct care.
  - b. An inter-jurisdictional transport of a patient for a maximum period of 72 hours as per s. 2.41 of The College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba General Regulations.
  - c. During a public health emergency as per s. 56(1) of the RHPA. In order for s.56(1) of the RHPA to apply, written notification from the minister of health is required for the College to modify or waive any requirements for registration or practice.
