Purpose:

The Philippines nursing registration examination offered in June 2006 for the purpose of establishing registration in the Philippines was compromised. It was determined by officials in the Philippines that copies of some of the examination questions were distributed in advance of the examination. To address the matter, the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) in the Philippines implemented a voluntary retake of the compromised test to resolve questions on the registration eligibility of those who passed the June 2006 examination.

The purpose of this policy is to set out the requirements for applicants to the College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba who wrote and passed the June 2006 Philippine nurse licensure examination to establish initial registration in the Philippines.

Policy:

1. Applicants who wrote the June 2006 licensure examination in the Philippines must provide proof of having successfully completed the special voluntary examination, Parts III (3) and V (5), which was authorized by the Philippine DOLE. Successful completion is the achievement of a score of 75% or better on these sections.
2. If an applicant has not written the special voluntary examination or cannot provide proof of such, their application for registration is not eligible for approval.
