# Complaints Investigation Committee Decision

## Voluntary Surrender

### Background

On July 19, 2019, the Complaints Investigation Committee (“the Committee”) was willing to accept from Mr. Martin an undertaking for regulatory monitoring. Mr. Martin refused to accept the undertaking. As a result, the Committee directed the CEO/Registrar of the College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba to impose the monitoring as a condition on Mr. Martin’s certificate of practice effective July 3, 2019.

Mr. Martin advised the Committee that he was not prepared to comply with the imposed condition. The Committee advised Mr. Martin that compliance with the condition is required. Mr. Martin again advised that he was not prepared to comply with the condition and offered to voluntarily surrender his certificate of practice.

The Committee agreed to accept Mr. Martin’s voluntary surrender of his certificate of practice, thus placing the condition in abeyance. The Committee also agreed to defer making a decision regarding Mr. Martin’s conduct during his interactions with the College and the Committee throughout this process.

In the event that Mr. Martin seeks to reinstate his certificate of practice, the Committee will require that he first submit specific information to the Committee. The Committee will at that time also address how Mr. Martin conducted himself during the above processes.

### Decision:

On August 22, 2019, the Complaints Investigation Committee accepted Mr. Martin’s voluntarily surrender of his certificate of practice.

The Committee believes that this voluntary surrender ought to be published to demonstrate transparency with its decision, as well to educate the public and RNs regarding the expectations that RNs comply with conditions, undertakings or orders.
