



## CCP Review FAQs

### Why do I need to participate in the CCP Review?

The CCP Review assures the public that you are committed to maintaining and improving your competence as an RN or RN(NP) as part of your legislated requirements.

### How do I know if I was selected for the review process?

RNs and RN(NP)s selected for the current year CCP Review will be notified by email during the month of July. The notification will include instructions on how to submit the annual requirements.

### If I am selected for the CCP Review, what do I need to complete?

In 2026, the College is redeveloping the CCP Review process. Registrants selected during this timeframe will be required to share their annual learning plan for review.

During renewal, which occurs between **October 1** and **December 1**, you will be prompted to enter your learning plan for the current year.

Important Reminders:

- Ensure you complete Parts A and B of the current year CCP forms before you log in to your CRNM Profile and complete your online renewal application. You will be prompted to enter your learning plan for the current year during your renewal.
- Keep a copy of your CCP forms for a minimum of five years as this can be requested for review at any time.

### Do I have to submit a learning plan if I am not working?

Yes, all registered nurses must complete a learning plan each year, even if they are not actively practicing. Your learning plan should align with the practice area you will resume following your leave or focus on learning activities that can be applied upon your return to work.

### Can I still renew while involved in the CCP process?

Yes, but you must have your learning plan completed as you will be required to enter your goal, activities and impact statement when prompted during the renewal process.

### Can I lose my Certificate of Practice (license) if I don't do well?

The Continuing Competence Program (CCP) is designed as a supportive and developmental tool for nurses. Participation in the CCP is not punitive, and outcomes from the process do not impact your license.

### What are the potential outcomes of the CCP Review?

You will receive an outcome for your learning plan, and your multisource feedback; these outcomes can be found [here](#).

## When do I find out how I did?

The outcome notification is emailed in February. As the CCP Review process is being redeveloped, learning plan outcomes may be provided as early as January.
