Complaints Investigation Committee Decision

Voluntary Surrender

On November 13, 2025, the Complaints Investigation Committee (the “Committee”) accepted Blake Morden’s (the “Registrant”) offer to voluntarily surrender their certificate of practice. As part of the voluntary surrender, the Committee directed a description of the circumstances that led to the voluntary surrender be published.

Decision

The College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba (the “College”) received a mandatory employer report related to the Registrant.

On May 12, 2025, the Committee determined it would accept an undertaking from the Registrant.

On August 15, 2025, the Registrant provided the College with a signed copy of the undertaking.

On November 13, 2025, the Registrant stated to the Committee that although he had initially accepted the undertaking he was unwilling to comply with the terms of his undertaking and wished to retire from registered nursing practice.

On November 13, 2025, the Committee accepted the Registrant’s offer to voluntarily surrender their certificate of practice

The Committee directed that the Registrant pay costs of \$500.

The voluntary surrender remains in effect until the Committee is satisfied that the conduct that was the subject of the investigation has been resolved and prior to the Committee’s consideration of the reinstatement of Registrant’s certificate of practice.

The Committee directs publication of its decision to educate the public and RNs regarding the expectation that RNs comply with *The Regulated Health Professions Act* (the “RHPA”) section 8 and to reinforce its view that this behavior is considered a serious breach of the College’s *Practice Direction: Practice Expectations for RNs and Code of Ethical Conduct*.
